Friday, February 2 is the Feast of the *Presentation of the Lord* (also known as Candlemas day).

The Mass (9:30am) on this day begins with a blessing of candles and a procession. If you have any candles that you wish to be blessed, you may bring them to the Church on that day so that they

may receive the blessing offered on this feast. This ancient feast marks the midpoint of winter, halfway between the shortest day and the spring equinox.

This commemorates the ritual purification of Mary 40 days after the birth of Jesus. On this day, Christians remember the presentation of Jesus Christ in the Temple. Forty days after the birth of a Jewish boy, it was the custom to take him to the temple in Jerusalem to be presented to God by his thankful parents.

In pre-Christian times this day was known as the "Feast of Lights" and was celebrated as winter gave way to spring.

SYNOD: PART I: THE FACE OF THE SYNODAL CHURCH



e) The Assembly frequently spoke of hope, healing, reconciliation, and restoration of trust among the many gifts the Spirit has poured out on the Church during this synodal process. Openness to listening and accompanying all, including those who have suffered abuse and hurt in or a syndol Church the Church, has made visible many who have long felt invisible. The long journey towards reconciliation and justice, including addressing the

structural conditions that abetted such abuse, remains before us, and requires concrete gestures of penitence.

f) We know that "synodality" is a term unfamiliar to many members of the People of God, causing some people confusion and concern. Among the fears expressed is that the teaching of the Church will be changed, causing us to depart from the Apostolic faith of our forebears and, in so doing, will fail to respond to needs of those who hunger and thirst for God today. However, we are confident that synodality is an expression of the dynamic and living Tradition.




