
Evening Mass will be celebrated March 11, 12 and 13, Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday at 7:00pm with a Mission presentation.

SYNOD: PART I: THE FACE OF THE SYNODAL CHURCH

Proposals:



The richness and depth of the synodal process indicates the value of expanding participation, and overcoming the obstacles to participation that have emerged so far.

There is a need to find ways to involve the clergy (deacons, priests, bishops) more actively in the synodal process during the

course of the next year. A synodal Church cannot do without their voices, experiences or contributions. We need to understand better the reasons why some have felt resistant to the synodal process.

The synodal culture needs to become more intergenerational, with spaces for young people to speak freely for themselves, within their families, and with their peers and pastors, including through digital channels.
