

OPENING THE WORD:

Today's Gospel completes a picture of Jesus' ministry: preaching, curing the sick, driving out demons, and then moving on to continue this work in another place. Mark's Gospel tells us that Jesus did this throughout Galilee.



Jesus' compassion and healing of the sick is a sign of the Kingdom of God. The Church continues to extend Christ's healing presence to others in its ministry to the sick. In the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick, the Church prays for spiritual and physical healing, forgiveness of sins, and comfort for those who are suffering from illness.

We also notice the importance of prayer in Jesus' daily life. Jesus rose early in the morning, removed himself from the crowds, and went to a deserted place to pray. When the disciples found him, he told them that it was time to move on. We believe that in his prayers Jesus found quidance and direction from God. We also bring our decision-making to God in prayer, asking for his guidance and direction in our lives.

SYNOD: PART I: THE FACE OF THE SYNODAL CHURCH

Proposals:



The Assembly proposes to promote theological deepening of the terminological and conceptual understanding of the notion and practice of synodality before the Second Session of the Assembly, drawing on the rich heritage of theological research since the Second Vatican Council and in particular the documents of the International Theological Commission on Synodality in the life and mission of the

Church (2018) and Sensus fidei in the life of the Church (2014).

- The canonical implications of synodality require similar clarification. For these, too, we propose an intercontinental special commission of theological and canonical experts, ahead of the Second Session of the Assembly.
- Finally, a wider revision of the Code of Canon Law and the Code of Canon Law of the Oriental Churches is called for at this time. A preliminary study is therefore advised.

Are we required to abstain from meat every Friday throughout the year?

Penance is necessary for all Christians as Jesus indicates when He says that all who want to be His followers must deny themselves, take up their cross, and follow Him. The Church mandates particular

penances to be observed by all God's people so that we can be united as one in these penitential practices. This is what the Code of Canon Law tells us:

Can. 1250 The penitential days and times in the universal Church are every Friday of the whole year and the season of Lent.

Can. 1251 Abstinence from meat, or from some other food as determined by the Episcopal Conference, is to be observed on all Fridays, unless a solemnity should fall on a Friday. Abstinence and fasting are to be observed on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Can. 1252 The law of abstinence binds those who have completed their fourteenth year. The law of fasting binds those who have attained their majority, until the beginning of their sixtieth year. Pastors of souls and parents are to ensure that even those who by reason of their age are not bound by the law of fasting and abstinence, are taught the true meaning of penance.

PROPOSALS FOR PARISH EVENTS:

If you have an event that your group or ministry has offered in the past, and would like to offer again, or if you have a new initiative, a proposal must be submitted to the office and be approved by the parish team. Proposals must be received in the office at least one month prior to the event. Last minute events cannot be guaranteed as any proposal is dependent upon the availability of rooms, the sanctuary, the parish hall, security, a/v and sound equipment, clergy, and liturgical requirements. All advertising, ticket sales and collections must also be approved and be included in the proposals. Any set up in the sanctuary must be taken down following the last Mass of the weekend so that the back area remains free of any and all objects and furniture during the week.

USER GROUPS:

It is very exciting to see the wonderful activities, events, and ministries that have started up at Holy Trinity. It is such a active and vibrant parish that strives to fulfill the mission that Jesus has bestowed upon the baptized. If you are a new group or ministry that is starting up or is planning an event, please drop by the parish office to fill out a "User Group Contract." A Parish Proposal will also need to be completed. It is important that the parish office can book you your desired room, A/V or sound equipment, and communicate and accommodate the group by coordinating the event with the services, clergy, or ministries that are required. For liturgical planning, please inform the office if your event will be an annual event.







