

SYNOD PART I: THE FACE OF THE SYNODAL CHURCH

4. People in Poverty, Protagonists of the Church's Journey:

e) Standing with those who are poor requires engaging with them in nodal Church caring for our common home: the cry of the earth and the cry of those living in poverty are the same cry. The lack of responses to this cry

makes the ecological crisis, and climate change in particular, a threat to the survival of humanity. The Apostolic Exhortation Laudate Deum, published by Pope Francis to coincide with the opening of the work of the Synod Assembly, emphasizes this.

The Church's commitment must address the causes of poverty and exclusion. f) This includes actions to protect the rights of those who are excluded, and this may require public denunciation of injustices, whether perpetrated by societal structures or by individuals, corporations or governments.

The world convinces us that the road to a happy life is to find ways to "fill up" ourselves. Only if we look this way, have these things, desire these riches and this power— will we be truly happy? The gospel invites us to discover that the road to a happy life is to find a way to "empty" ourselves. It is, as Jesus reveals in Mark's Gospel, the path of losing oneself, being the least, and being the servant of all that will lead us to fullness of life. Indeed, this path reveals that the secret of life is not to be "filled up" but to be "fulfilled." Choosing this path, however, means that we must give up being the "lord of our lives," making sure that we have managed and controlled our lives in ways of happiness. In contrast, to lose oneself for another, or to be of service to another in sacrificial love, means that we are willing to stop being the "lord of our lives," trusting that God will provide the new life that comes from living this paschal mystery.

Our Lenten practices have helped us to grow in this very way of trusting in God. We have given more time in prayer, curbed our desires for material things, and have been more generous with the poor. Each of these activities has helped us to die in small ways—giving up our time, our self fulfillment, and our self-centeredness—in order that we might grow in our trust of God. These Lenten practices have helped us to confirm ourselves more closely to the suffering and death of Christ, so that we might share more fully in the new life that dying to oneself inaugurates.

As we enter this holiest of weeks, we are called to pray for the grace of trust, especially in those situations that are most trying or seem the darkest. This week provides us with an opportunity to name those situations and to see them through the lens of **trust** in God that Jesus has.
