



SYNOD PART I: THE FACE OF THE SYNODAL CHURCH

4. People in Poverty, Protagonists of the Church's Journey:

c) Poverty is not just of one kind. Among the many faces of those in poverty are those who do not have the things they need to lead a dignified life. There are also migrants and refugees; indigenous peoples, original and Afro-descendent

peoples; those who suffer violence and abuse, in particular women; people struggling with addiction; minorities who are systematically denied a voice; abandoned elderly people; victims of racism, exploitation, and trafficking, especially minors; exploited workers; the economically excluded, and others living on the peripheries. The most vulnerable of the vulnerable, on whose behalf constant advocacy is needed, include the unborn and their mothers.

Please note all quotes are taken from the XVI Ordinary General Assembly of the Synod of Bishops: A Synodal Church in Mission Synthesis Report.

As Jesus commissions his disciples to be witnesses to what Scriptures foretold, our celebration of the Eucharist commissions us. Like the disciples, we are sent to announce the good news of Jesus' forgiveness of sins.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION COORDINATOR

The Sacramental Preparation coordinator works closely with the staff, parents, schools and children of the parish through age appropriate activities, school visits and catechetical classes.

Anyone applying for the position must be a practicing Catholic in good standing. All applicants must have experience working with children, knowledge of, or willingness to learn and coordinate the following programs: First Reconciliation, First Communion and Confirmation classes for children, classroom visits and other Catechetical programs for children at the Parish. The position will also involve collaboration with the Catechism coordinator, parents and schools. A certificate in Religious Education is required at minimum, and a Bachelor of Education would be advantageous. Other related skills include: liturgy planning; interpersonal skills; public speaking; organizational, management and administrative skills; creativity in program design and development; computer skills, including word processing; teaching techniques for children; energy, enthusiasm and commitment. Must be willing to work evenings and weekends.


